SUBJECT: PRIMARY EXIT PROFILE (PEP) ABILITY TEST POSTPONEMENT AND CANCELLATION OF PERFORMANCE TASK (GRADE 6)

Dear Colleagues,

The Ministry of Education and Youth uses this medium to advise our stakeholders that after consultation among the members of the National Standards Curriculum (NSC) and Primary Exit Profile (PEP) Monitoring Committee held last Friday, February 11, we have decided to:

- 1) Postpone the Grade 6 Primary Exit Profile **Ability Test** from its originally scheduled date of **February 22, 2022** to **March 24, 2022**;
- Cancel the Grade 6 Performance Based Tests (PT) scheduled for March 22 and 24, 2022 and
- 3) Maintain the Grade 6 Curriculum Based Tests (CBT) as scheduled for April27 and 28, 2022

The updated PEP 4-6 examination dates are as follows:

Please be assured that this decision was taken to make changes to the administration dates against the background of concerns raised by stakeholders in the education sector, feedback from teachers via an electronic survey and recommendations made at last Friday's meeting of the NSC and PEP Monitoring Committee.

The Ministry accepted the recommendation to postpone the PEP Ability Test and administer it at the scheduled date of the Performance Task, cancel the Performance Task and administer the Curriculum-Based Test as scheduled given that:

- More than 70% of the teachers who responded to the survey stated that students were not ready for the assessment and 59% preferred a change in the date of the assessment;
- The current cohort of students has been in and out of the physical school environment since the second term of Grade 4 (when the COVID-19 pandemic caused the physical closure of schools);
- Some students may not have had full access to the curriculum in the remote environment which may have negatively affected the grasp of fundamental skills that are necessary for the application of analytical thinking that is required to successfully do the Ability Test;
- Most, if not all, of the students are still trying to cope with the psychological demands of the pandemic whilst readjusting to routine of in-person learning.
