


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Your teacher recommended the following two sources to help you gather relevant information for your essay.

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Source 2

The Jamaican Queen

As we celebrate our black leaders, we must pay tribute to a powerful woman, Queen Nanny. Nanny was a leader of the Maroons at the beginning of the 18th century. She was known by both the Maroons and the British settlers as an outstanding military leader who became, in her lifetime and after, a symbol of unity and strength for her people during times of crisis.

A small, muscular woman with piercing eyes, she was known for her exceptional leadership qualities. Her influence over the Maroons was strong, and she was very skilled in preparing the Eastern Maroons for battle. The Maroons were always ready. This kept away the British soldiers who attempted to enter the mountains and overpower them. She also led many raids on plantations and is said to have helped to free many enslaved Africans.

Besides inspiring her people to be courageous in battles, Nanny was also a leader and the wise woman of the village. She passed down legends and encourgaed the sharing of African customs, music and songs. These were a source of confidence and pride for the Maroons. Queen Nanny led her people with courage. She inspired them to maintain the spirit of freedom. Being independent was the true inheritance of the enlsaved Africans.

i. Who was one of Jamaica's freedom fighters in the early 18th century?


ii. How have persons helped to shape Jamaica's history before and after Emancipation?
