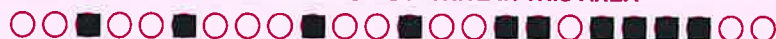

Introduction to Task

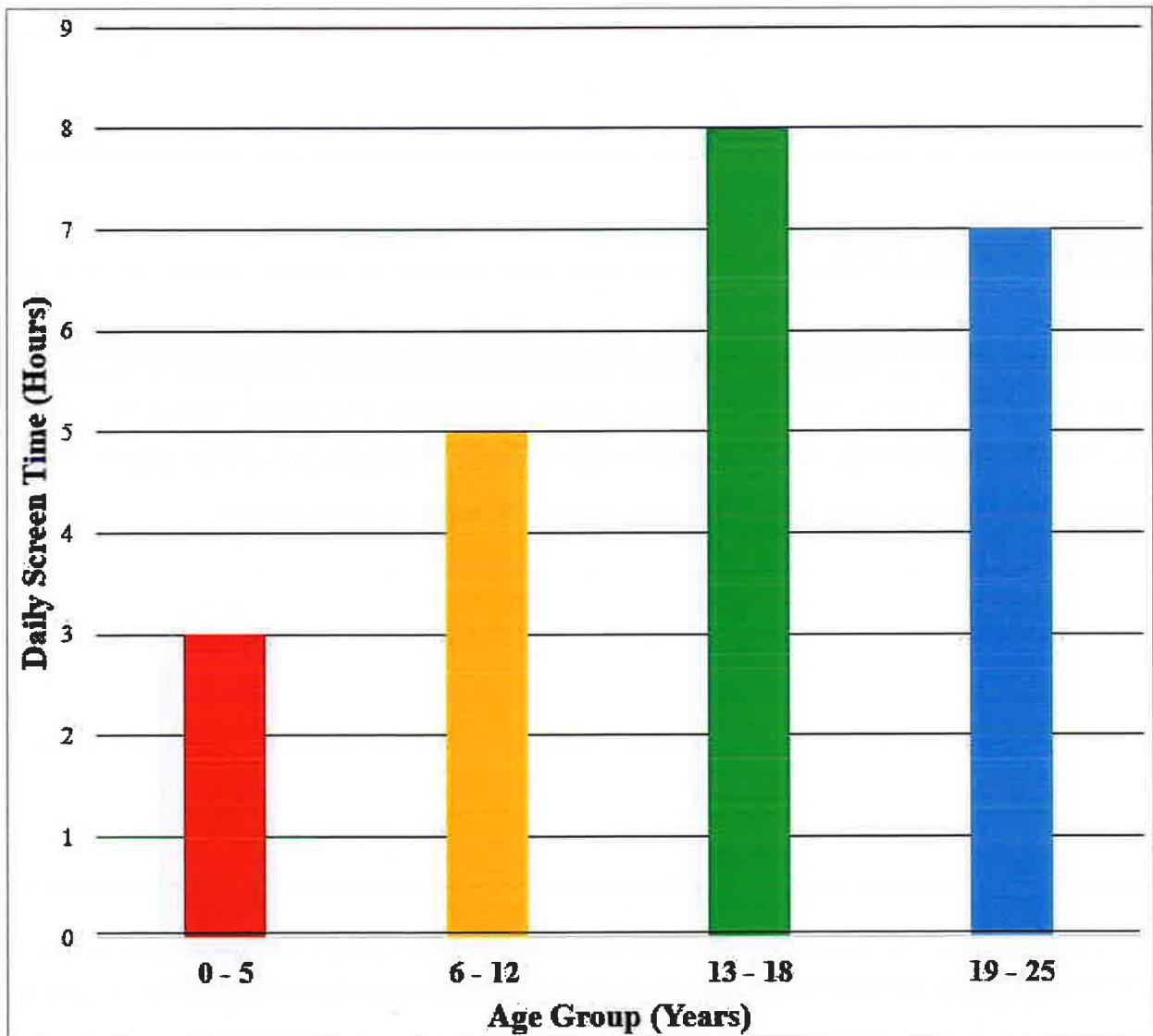

While researching, you found two (2) sources. **Source 1** is a bar graph showing daily screen time usage by age group. **Source 2** is an article.

What is screen time?

Screen time is time spent watching television, playing a video game, or using an electronic device with a screen (such as a smartphone or tablet).

Managing Screen Time

With screens virtually everywhere, monitoring a child's screen time can be challenging. But screen time is not the only issue. Another concern is *what* the child is watching. Some content may be educational while others may be negatively contributing to a child's development. So what should parents do? Understanding the impact of too much screen time is a good place to start. The next step is to make a plan for how children will be allowed to use screen time.

The problem with screens

Too much screen time and frequently watching harmful content have been linked to:

- Obesity
- Not getting enough sleep
- Behavioural problems
- Delays in language development
- Violence
- Attention problems
- Less time doing school work



Developing screen time rules

The American Academy of Paediatrics discourages screen time for children under two years old. And for children over two years, *supervised use of electronic devices* is recommended.

For older children, there should be a limit on screen time each day. Experts in child development recommend:

- Controlling time spent on electronic devices
- Keeping screens out of the child's bedroom
- Using apps that control the length of time a child can use a device
- Helping children to know the difference between appropriate and inappropriate content
