## Dear Colleagues,

The Ministry of Education, Skills, Youth and Information (MoESYI) wishes to advise our stakeholders that the students currently in Grade 4 will sit their component of the Primary Exit Profile (PEP) on **Wednesday**, **June 18**, **2025**, and **Thursday**, **June 19**, **2025**.

Structure of PEP 4 Examinations

## DAY 1(Wednesday, June 18, 2025)

Literacy Test and Language Arts Performance Task Test

## DAY 2 (Thursday, June 19, 2025)

Numeracy Test and Mathematics Performance Task Test

## Literacy Test – 40 minutes

This test will assess students' basic reading and comprehension skills. It consists of 30 multiple-choice questions. Students will be required to shade their responses to each question on a separate answer sheet similar to the one attached to this bulletin.

## Language Arts Performance Task – 11/2 Hours

This test will assess students' ability to gather information from multiple sources. Here students will be assessed in Reading, Writing and Research. The Grade 4 Language Arts Performance Task test will consist of four to six questions. It will cover content outlined in the National Standards Curriculum (NSC). Space will

be provided for students to write their responses to each question in the test booklet provided.

## Numeracy Test – 40 minutes

This test will assess students' basic understanding and use of numbers. It consists of 30 multiple-choice questions. Students will be required to shade their response to each question on a separate answer sheet, similar to the one attached to this bulletin.

#### Mathematics Performance Task – 11/2 Hours

This test assesses students' ability to demonstrate understanding of mathematical concepts. Students will be assessed in mathematical concepts and procedures, problem-solving, communicating reasoning and modelling. The Grade 4 Mathematics Performance Task test will consist of four to six questions. Students will be given an opportunity, based on a scenario, to make their unique choices. The test will cover content outlined in the National Standards Curriculum (NSC). Space will be provided for students to write their responses to each question in the test booklet provided.

## The Teacher Activity

The Teacher Activity for each subject will be dispatched to Regional Offices during the week of May 26 – 30, 2025, after which they will be distributed to schools. The Teacher Activity is a preparatory discussion which serves as an opportunity to engage students' thought processes in a very general way prior to the administration of the Performance Tasks.

## Content to be Assessed by the Performance Task Tests

The following table shows the areas from the NSC that may be assessed on the Performance Task in each subject for 2025.
